Burghfield Mortimer and District Food Bank

On behalf of Churches Together in Burghfield, Sulhamstead and Mortimer, grateful thanks to everyone who made donations to the Food Bank in 2014. Food Bank volunteers distributed **238 Food Parcels** to local people in 2014, 85 to people in Burghfield Common, 68 to people in Mortimer and 85 to people living in the District. (The District stretches from Aldermaston through Theale and Beech Hill to Arborfield.)

The Food Bank supported **58 local households** with donated food in 2014, 24 households in Burghfield Common, 12 households in Mortimer and 22 households in the District. This is an extra 73 Food Parcels distributed in 2014 compared with 2013.

Jenny is a TiM Friends volunteer and shares her client's experience of this local activity. "Doreen really loves the Singing for the Brain session that takes place in the Burghfield Common Methodist Church Hall every second Wednesday afternoon. There is a welcome cup of tea and a biscuit and a relaxing atmosphere. We sing songs, usually on a theme, that most of us know or can easily pick up and there are sometimes songs that

involve us using percussion instruments as well as actions, producing smiles all round. Doreen and I always end up singing more songs on the drive home afterwards."




the charity. In 2014 across the UK we raised £9,500 just from recycling everyday rubbish!

Initially The Wessex Electricity Company installed three lights and one 15-amp 3-pin plug free for each new customer in Mortimer; many thought this sufficient and rigged up complicated webs of wires, often running their appliances off the five-amp lighting circuit via bayonet extensions in the bulb sockets.

A day in the life...

BBC Berkshire's roving reporters were back in Mortimer last month wanting to know more about Dad's Shop and taking a coffee break in the Café. The big news though was that Tony Blackburn, recently celebrating his 50 years in radio, had heard a rumour that an old shipmate from his "pirate" days was still alive and living in Mortimer. The partner in piracy, who Tony thought had died years ago, was said to be walking around and last seen on Budgen's customer services till. So the



reporter "tweeted" the inevitable selfie...of Richard Swainson. That was convincing but Tony did a final check - phoning Richard to ask him his nickname from offshore radio days. "Sally", came the reply. "That's him!", exclaimed (Bessie) Blackburn.

Most of us, even the Mortimer Pirate Club (both of us), had missed the fact that 50 years ago Richard worked for the music producer who'd become frustrated at the hopeless battle to get radio airplay for songs. 'Needletime' was limited to two hours per week on the BBC. He decided to fix it by starting his own radio station on a boat anchored off Essex. He asked Richard if he fancied becoming link man between land and sea for what became Radio Caroline. Richard was up for a challenge and so became a central part of the 1960s radio and pop revolution, working with Tony and later, having been poached by Radio London, household names including John Peel and Kenny Everett. They invited Richard to BBC Berkshire last month to reunite with Tony after 30 years. After the emotion of the entrance, and some views on who looked younger, (which Richard won comfortably), they chatted on air about the old times as colleagues and friends. An amazing story!
