We have been set 100 challenges by our Headquarters Commissioner to complete by the end of the year. Our Life President, Mr Peter Johnson, who has been a member of the Group for over 80 years, was awarded *Chevalier* (Knight) of the *Légion d'Honneur* by the French government in recognition of brave and valiant service in the D-Day Landings. Peter was a Royal Marine Commando attached to 539 Flotilla RM, and was charged with landing the Green Howards on Gold Beach. After making four landings he navigated up the River Orme with senior commanders to Pegasus Bridge. Our heartfelt congratulations go out to Peter who has been a lifelong servant, not just to our Group, but to the community of Mortimer as a whole.

Burghfield & Mortimer Handybus

Welcome to YOUR community minibus service. The Burghfield and Mortimer Handybus is a 9/10 seater minibus modified to provide easy access, including low steps and a



passenger lift to enable wheelchair bound passengers to board. The bus is provided by West Berkshire Council and operated by local volunteers to offer a service to those with limited mobility or who are unable to use, or don't have access to, public transport.

We operate around Burghfield, Mortimer, Sulhamstead and Ufton Nervet and we have a schedule of regular shopping trips as well as carrying passengers to social club meetings, the local cinema and outings to local places of interest. We currently make over 3,000 passenger trips per year but sometimes have empty seats available, so if you would like to take advantage of our service please talk to one of our Handybus Coordinators, Don or Phil.

Providing this valuable community service is dependent on volunteers, both drivers and escorts, and we are always in need of more help to meet the growing demand. Volunteers need no special skills, just a friendly caring outlook with a few hours to spare (per week, per fortnight or even per month), so if you would like to join a small band of friendly volunteers then we would like to hear from you.

Mortimer Fun Day 2016



As with any team, we continually need to involve new recruits as existing volunteers move on or change responsibilities, or simply as contingency for the future.

A number of roles need to be filled this year, so if you have enjoyed the Fun Day in the past and wish for it to continue, or indeed if you have had any reason to criticise it (*Ed: surely not?!*), this is the perfect opportunity to get involved, to give something back and to steer the development of your Fun Day for years to come. Positions available are:


Santa's Grotto & Mortimer Christmas Market

You are probably reading this in the comfort of your warm home, perhaps whilst sat by the fire or curled up cosily on the sofa. Spare a thought for our Mortimer man, Richard



Wattam, aka Dick of "Dick & Layney's Place" bar at the Mortimer Fun Day. By now Richard will be part way through his epic challenge, Rowing Across the Atlantic.

The crew of eight come from all parts of the globe. They met up on 23rd January and (at time of going to press) were due to set off from Gran Canaria around 30th January, dependent on weather, with the goal of rowing 2989 miles to Barbados in 32 days or less to beat the current World Record.

On board they will row in shifts, with four men rowing two hours on / two hours off, nonstop for the entire trip, feeding on high energy dried food. Richard trained hard during 2015 with the last few weeks concentrating on weight gain to give him a little extra fuel.

Richard is raising funds for Thames Valley Air Ambulance in memory of his close friend Pete Barnes, who used to fly the Air Ambulance before his tragic death in the Vauxhall helicopter crash in 2013. Richard is being sponsored by local companies CTS and Haines Farm Eggs, and Nationwide Metal Recycling from Norfolk, who have all given generously to the charity.

Since we started in September 2015, over 800 items have already been shared, including bags, baby stuff, kitchenware, craft materials, furniture and jam. Members have also offered their time, such as support for breast-feeding mums, parents of children with special needs, people wanting to learn to crochet and others who want to lose weight. We have even held social events including a Thanksgiving party, a Cheese and Wine evening and a beginners knitting group so far.

Thrive: Gardening Charity (www.thrive.org.uk)

Thrive is the leading charity in the UK that uses gardening to bring about positive changes in the lives of people who are living with disabilities or ill health, or who are isolated, disadvantaged or vulnerable. This is known as social and therapeutic horticulture. A couple of years ago MVP donated funds to help create a children's garden titled "Just For Fun". The garden, now one of many, is fully established and enjoyed at the centre in Beech Hill.

Mortimer Past & Present

How Big Is Mortimer?



Mortimer residents may feel the village has grown too much and may even feel resentment that West Berkshire Council recently defined Mortimer as a rural service centre. Historically, however, it seems that Stratfield Mortimer has always been significantly larger than the surrounding villages and has therefore fulfilled that role for centuries by providing services that weren't available in smaller neighbouring villages.

The Saxon name for what we now call Stratfield Mortimer was Stratfield Magna. From Magna Carta we should all know (even David Cameron!) that Magna means "great" in Latin; a good indication that we were already the biggest of the Stratfield villages, being villages by the fields along the Roman Road.

The Domesday Book of 1086 lists, among other things, the number of "villeins, bordars, cottagers and serfs" in each village. The first three of these were freemen, holding progressively less land in the order listed; serfs were effectively slaves. Researchers think that the numbers listed are those of men of working age or households, and they often multiply this by 4.5 to give a rough estimate of population.

In Stratfield Mortimer there were 77 households with 21 villeins, 38 bordars and 18 serfs. This, in Domesday Book research, is classified as a Very Large Village with an estimated population of 350. As a comparison, the area currently encompassed by Burghfield and Burghfield Common had about 20 households and an estimated population of 90 (Medium Village), Padworth had 19 households, Ufton Nervet 13, Silchester 39, and even Aldermaston was only 50 households (Large Village).

There is no evidence of the plague or any other disaster ever decimating the Mortimer population. It appears to have flourished and been a locally large village ever since. At the 2011 census our population was 3807, so it has grown just over tenfold since 1086. In contrast, Burghfield had grown to 5995, 66 times its 1086 population.
