#### The Iranian Feast - 5<sup>th</sup> March 2016



I'm not sure anyone knew quite what to expect from the Iranian Feast: billed as a play where the audience would sit in an Iranian family's sitting room and sample traditional Persian food made during the performance, it always sounded intriguing. The opening seemed like it might be the story of a "normal" family with "normal" tensions - the husband, Abbas, deciding to have a party without giving his wife, Maryam, any notice; the wife frustrated with his lack of communication; the student daughter, Eli, wanting to go out with her friends

rather than do the family thing. But very quickly we discovered that this party had another purpose, a public revealing of many thoughts and secrets. At first, as we tried the tasty Persian food, we were all acclaimed as important friends, a community that had sustained this family through the dark times when Abbas had been imprisoned years ago as a dissident in Teheran.

But why is he so jumpy and nervous while declaring all this love for his friends? Why is Eli so adamant that she wants to go out? Gradually we discover the frightening secrets of this family living under the harsh Iranian regime. Abbas was released from prison on condition he takes a job processing information about possible dissidents - his family have never known this; Eli is a dissident - her family didn't know this - and her best friend and co-dissident is escaping Iran that night. And now they are all in danger by decisions Abbas has taken at work.

As we ate the delicious morsels together, it became apparent that all was not quite as it seemed. Having been drawn into their community, we had to face tricky moral questions and think about how we would deal with repressions of the state. Survival always comes at a price. ANNUAL GENERAL
