Mortimer Green Group is looking at ways the village can reduce its carbon footprint. We have two ongoing projects. The first is to find land for people interested in growing food. We have two potential plots – the first at the Chapel along Welshman's Road, the second behind the Horse & Groom garden. Nearly 200 people expressed interest in allotment/growing space in the Parish Plan questionnaire so we do need more land. Our other project is producing a database of people who have installed solar heating, photovoltaic panels or have similar energy producing/saving projects. We hope that this information will be available to share and support other people in the village who are considering whether to put renewable energy devices in their homes.
