None of this would have been successful, however, without the families, organisations and businesses who made the fantastic scarecrows, the four sponsors of the event, Sansome & George, Parkers, Spratleys, and Nancy Nisbet for the Photography, the judges who had the unenviable task of picking the best three scarecrows and the local businesses who sold the trail maps on behalf of the MVP – a huge thank you to all of the above and to all of you who walked around scarecrow spotting. Community Planning Grant MVP has just received a grant of £2500 from West Berkshire Council to purchase training and digital media (a video camera, multi media projector and IT editing software) for the village. The young people in the Youth Club will be trained in video production and presentation skills and then they in turn will pass these skills down to others in the village (very likely an older generation). This project will be a reversal of the 'normal' training/teaching model – young people will be givers not recipients. We hope that this will be another way to bridge the perceived gap between generations and encourage more interaction and greater understanding and respect. It is intended that the equipment will be available to affiliated groups (see next page) in the future.

Would you like faster broadband in Mortimer? Here is a chance to help put Mortimer on the map and drastically improve our infrastructure. All you have to do is go to the BT website (<u>racetoinfinity.bt.com</u>) and enter your Mortimer postcode. BT has launched a new UK-wide public survey to find the UK's next fibre-optic based high-speed internet hotspots. Communities that want access to BT's high-speed Infinity network will need to

contact BT, for the network provider to ascertain levels of demand for the service across Britain. BT has committed to wiring up the five exchanges that show the highest demand for fibre from the online survey.
