Bags2school - Tuesday 15 March

The MVP has once again, joined forces with St John's and St Mary's schools to extend their second hand clothing collection fundraiser. By the 6 March a number of areas of the village will receive bags from us to collect unwanted clothes in good condition. You can also include handbags, belts, shoes, soft toys, bed linen, curtains, sheets and blankets (no bric-a-brac, duvets, pillows or material off cuts please!)

We provide one bag to get you started but you can fill as many as you like – and either leave at the front of your property or deliver them to a central collection point for your road (which will be advised on your bag) by 9am on Tuesday 15th MARCH** alternatively you may take your bags directly to St John's School by 9am on Wednesday 16th March

We know that you all get bags through your door on a regular basis but the real advantage of *Bags to school* is that this scheme directly benefits *THIS* community. All money raised goes in equal parts to the two schools and the MVP for future village projects. So please do have a good clear out for the 15 March!

If you do not receive a bas2school bag by 6th March, then your area is not on our collection route. But you can get together with your neighbours to fill 20 bags then call Rebecca Barker on 9332008 and we will arrange to collect from you.
