#### **Mortimer Youth Club** (MVP affiliate)



# How many public recreation grounds does Mortimer have?



The answer is two. Everyone knows the Fairground, but do you know about the 'Alfred Palmer Memorial Field'? Alfred Palmer, a member of the Palmer family, proprietors of the Huntley & Palmers biscuit manufacturers of Reading, had his country estate at Wokefield Park. He died in 1936 aged 84 and is buried in St. Mary's Churchyard. In his memory his five grandchildren donated the field to the right of the Turners Arms. This is managed by a charitable trust whose purpose is to "...hold the land ...as a public ground for the resort and recreation of and as playgrounds for or otherwise for the benefit of the

inhabitants of the Parishes of Mortimer and Wokefield." As you enter the field from West End Road you will see two stone gateposts and if you look very closely at the stones there are two barely legible inscriptions commemorating this.
