Welcome to MVP's Autumn Newsletter.

Our Village has been buzzing with events and activities over the summer. We held a tremendously successful **Fun Day** and we do hope that all of you who came along enjoyed the day as much as we did. Even the weather was kind to us! It now seems ages ago that we held the event and it will not be long before we are turning our minds to next year!

We are very pleased to report that we will be distributing **£4000 to local groups**. St John's Hall will receive £1000 towards their much needed new roof, the Community Centre will get £1000 to finally purchase their curtains, the Youth Club will receive £1000 to support the young people of the village undertaking their Duke of Edinburgh Awards and finally a further £1000 will be distributed in £100 lots to various local groups – the first to benefit are Mortimer St John's and St Mary's Schools and Mortimer Mother and Toddler Group.



This event could not have happened without a great deal of support from **Burghfield and Sulhamstead Scouts and Together in Mission** also, our **sponsors, local organisations and business** in our community. Our heartfelt thanks go to all of them and also to the army of volunteers who freely gave their time to run the stalls and activities; their muscles to set up marquees and move furniture, and their donations for tombola, raffle and cakes. There will be a formal handing over the cheques to the beneficiaries of the Fun Day on **Sunday 30th October at**

4.30pm in the Community Centre. This will be immediately before the winners of the scarecrow trail are announced. **Please come along and join us.**

Finally like all such things this kind of event doesn't just run it's self. Although the army of volunteers are vital we do desperately need people who would be willing to help <u>manage</u> areas. Mortimer Energy Initiative

Since its launch at the Mortimer Fun Day, the Mortimer Energy Initiative has begun to gather pace. Organised by **John Langford (01189 331598**) the Initiative encourages the uptake of Solar PV systems within the village and outlying areas.



John has negotiated a fantastic discount scheme with an Installer well known in the Reading area as a competitive and professional Solar PV installation company with several years experience in the renewable energy field.

So far 19 surveys have been carried out leading to four orders of which two have already been successfully installed. Agreed, retrospective discounts will be paid once the scheme closes. The more installations completed the greater the discount.

The scheme closes to new enquiries at the end of October, so don't miss out on this opportunity to have a top quality Solar PV system, professionally installed, and take advantage of the Feed in Tariff which is due for review next April.

Mortimer and District Flower Circle - A view from a new(ish) member

Two years ago my sister in law invited me to go along with her to a club, as she knew I am interested in gardening and all things to do with flowers and plants, she thought I would enjoy it. She was right! On that first evening the demonstrator was wonderful, full of entertaining chat, which had us all chuckling away and she soon filled the stage with flowers of all colours and in a number of different designs. To top it all I won one of the arrangements in the raffle at the end of the evening - a fabulous evening's entertainment, and all for £3.50! I was hooked. Eventually I realised that flower arranging is about far more than just flowers. Some also combine fabrics and other materials into their designs, many of which really could be called works of art as different colours, textures and materials are combined to produce amazing results. As well as the usual ceramics and basket ware, I have seen old satellite dishes, bits of cars and washing machine doors used as containers – the only constraint is your imagination it seems!

Needless to say I am now choosing plants for my garden with an eye to how I might use the foliage in the future and I have my own little nursery of cuttings, which is not only great because they are 'free' plants, but they also remind me either the people who gave them to me or the place where I collected them – with permission of course! Members can bring along plants, produce, cuttings from their own gardens, which are sold on a 'bring and buy' table.

The members are friendly and welcoming, and many have a wealth of knowledge and expertise themselves that they



are happy to share. I was able to buy all of the oasis and other materials, I needed, very cheaply, at the club sales table to get me started.

I have never been short of enthusiasm – skill is another thing, however I persevered with my entries at the monthly competition and hope that the demonstrator, who is often a qualified judge, will offer a little helpful and encouraging advice. I continue to practise between meetings as supermarket flowers are plentiful, cheap and usually last well, so my hall table is never without an arrangements of sorts, which makes our home more welcoming.

So, if you are interested in plants and flowers, want to learn more about flower arranging or just watch others create their own designs, do come along to one of the meetings. On the **second Monday of the month at St John's Hall, Mortimer, except in October when it will be on the first Monday, 3rd October.**

Help is at hand to switch to digital TV

TV is switching to digital all over the UK and in 2012 the traditional TV signal will be switched off in the Meridian region. If you don't have digital TV by the time of switchover, you will lose your TV channels

The BBC-run Switchover Help Scheme is concerned that no-one is left with a blank screen after the switchover and offers practical help for older and disabled people to convert one TV set to digital, including installation of the easy-to-use equipment, a demonstration of how to use it and 12 months of aftercare service including a free helpline.

Eligible people have been sent a Help Scheme information pack through the post explaining the help available. Most people will be asked to pay £40 towards the standard option of help. You are eligible for the Help Scheme if you are:

- aged 75 or over, or
- live in a care home (for six months or more), or
- receive (or could get):
 - o Disability Living Allowance (DLA), or
 - o Attendance or Constant Attendance Allowance, or
 - o Mobility Supplement, or
- registered blind or partially sighted

There will be extensive TV coverage about the Help Scheme and eligible people

will receive an information pack but to get the help they are entitled to they must respond to the letter. /

Some RNLI Facts - rnli.org.uk

The cost of running the RNLI averages £398,000 each day. For every pound raised 84 pence is spent on operations and 16 pence is spent on generating the income.

The RNLI fleet has more than 330 active lifeboats and about 115 lifeboats in a relief fleet. The lifeboats vary in type from small rigid inflatable boats, used in rescues close to the shore, to 17 metre all-weather vessels that are used in rescues that are in the open sea.

In 2010: There were 8,713 lifeboat launches and 8,313 people were rescued. Surprisingly most launches occurred during light to moderate winds. 34% of launches were in the dark. There were 15 lifeboat launches on Christmas day.
