# PROJECT LINUS UK

Project Linus UK is a volunteer organization supported by Mortimer's Friday Afternoon Club. We aim to provide a sense of security and comfort to sick and traumatised babies, children and teenagers through the provision of new, home-made patchwork quilts and knitted/crocheted blankets. We give volunteers across the UK the opportunity to contribute to their local community.

## **Burghfield & Mortimer Handybus**

The Burghfield and Mortimer Handybus provides a community minibus service that also covers Sulhamstead and Ufton Nervet. The service is provided by a 10/12-seater minibus which has been modified to provide easy access, including a passenger lift for wheelchair users. The service operates to help those with limited mobility or people who are unable to use, or don't have access to public transport.

We currently run regular shopping trips to Sainsbury's in Calcot and Tadley, as well as to Reading and Newbury. In addition, we make regular trips to local social club meetings, West Berkshire Therapy Centre, garden centres and cinemas, and frequent social outings to other local places of interest. Pick up and drop off is from passengers' home addresses. The service is operated on a voluntary, non-profit making basis, but a passenger donation is usually made to cover the supply and operation of our minibus. Donations are typically £3.00 return for a Sainsbury's shopping trip, £4.00 return for a Reading trip and £5.00 return for a Newbury trip. We currently make over 3,000 passenger trips per year but often have empty seats available, so if you would like to take advantage of our service please talk to one of our co-ordinators (details below).

## 1<sup>st</sup> Burghfield & Sulhamstead Scouts

Dozens of Beavers and Scouts are learning about the woodland management cycle as part of a creative initiative taking place on the Englefield Estate as a collaborative project between the Beaver and Cub Sco



collaborative project between the Beaver and Cub Scouts, the Estate and chainsaw carver and carpenter Nick Speakman.

Around eighty Beavers, Cubs and their families, including Burghfield's Voyager Beavers working towards their Community Impact badges, visited the woodland to learn from Forestry Manager Richard Edwards and experience a timber harvester in action.

Later in the summer, Nick Speakman of 3DWood sculpted a wooden bench with a scouting theme from a tree growing in the Benyon's Inclosure woodland. This has been installed near to where the Scouts saw the trees being felled, and was recently visited by a group of seventy-five Beavers and Cubs during the Big Beaver Hike last month. A group will return to the woodland in the autumn to plant saplings, replacing those felled and continuing the woodland management cycle.

Richard Edwards explained: "The first stage of the project involved Nick talking to the group about product design and the variety of approaches that can be taken when making a wooden bench. They then went away and created a number of different designs using modelling clay, which gave Nick inspiration for the final sculpture. The second session involved the group visiting the forest and learning about woodland management including why we cut down trees, what we can make out of timber and how wood is a sustainable resource. They also got to see a timber harvester working and had the chance to sit in the cab, which they very much enjoyed! They were asking lots of questions and showing a real interest in what we do here."

So impressed were the Berkshire Scouts with the initiative, that they pledged a grant of £200 for the project. Beaver Scout leader Helen Townsend said: "The Beavers, Cubs and their families were blown away with the harvester. We are very grateful to have had the chance to see such a machine in action. The children were fascinated and, even on an extremely hot evening, Rich was great at holding their attention and making the forestry cycle interesting for them. His jokes went down well too!"

## **Mortimer Surgery Patient Participation Group (PPG)**

All NHS organisations, which include GP surgeries, have a duty to set up PPGs to enable patient representatives to be involved, where appropriate, with the practice.

The Mortimer PPG is a group of around 12 patient representatives who, together with the Practice Manager and a GP, meet every 6 weeks in the surgery. The group does not handle or receive complaints but welcomes comments and suggestions to help improve the patient experience in the surgery, which can then be added to the agenda, for discussion at our meetings with the practice representatives. The GP and Practice Manager also present information about the practice to the meeting.

The PPG conducts patient surveys and arranges public meetings on behalf of the practice, such as a Diabetes Information evening, to which patients and the wider public are invited. On Tuesday 10<sup>th</sup> October, 10:30-13:00 at the Burghfield Community Sports Association on James Lane, Burghfield, a range of speakers will give advice on "Life and Death Matters", covering all aspects of end-of-life planning, including medical care, legal & financial matters, funeral arrangements and community resources. Every month all the local PPG representatives meet to share ideas and best practice together with staff from the North and West Reading Clinical Commissioning Group (CCG) to enable feedback from the surgeries to be communicated to the CCG management team for consideration and action.




