Mortimer Surgery Patient Participation Group

As a surgery we have continued to face a very challenging workload in the face of significant staffing problems. We do operate a same-day triage call list aimed at urgent clinical issues that need to be dealt with that day and we would ask patients who have administrative or non-urgent issues to use the routine bookable slots accessible either online or through reception. Most GPs are continuing to offer telephone assessment first for booked appointments with face-to-face appointments offered when clinically appropriate, or after discussion with the patient.

We are pleased that we have 2 new GPs joining us:

Dr Alastair Petter will be joining us at the end of February doing 6 sessions over 4 days a week. He is doing some morning sessions before he starts. **Dr Jason Seewoodhary** is a locum GP who will be working 2 full days to cover Dr Homfray's maternity leave.

Dr Seewoodhary and Dr Petter have significant experience in general practice.

Unfortunately we're struggling to staff our nursing team due to maternity leave and other reasons. We hope to recruit new nurses soon but some non-urgent services offered by the treatment room will be temporarily restricted for the short term.

The Covid vaccination clinics offered by our PCN group through Pangbourne surgery have continued up to now, increasing the delivery of booster vaccines and contributing over 50,000 vaccines in total. Some of the sessions were covered by Mortimer GPs and nursing staff who worked over the Christmas holidays to provide these appointments. As demand reduces, these clinics will operate in a restricted fashion over the next month or two. Patients eligible for the Pangbourne clinics will continue to be notified directly.

Thank you to our patients for their understanding and support in what continues to be a very challenging time for the NHS. Dr Gill French

The modest rent received by the Charity from leasing the Fairground is used to make grants to a number of local bodies whose work supports those residents of Stratfield Mortimer who might need a little extra help. Mortimer Bell Ringers

Our band of ringers from Burghfield, Mortimer and surrounding areas, have been very busy over the last few weeks. We have four people who have come along to learn to ring and they are all progressing well. It takes time to get the basic



handling of the rope and bell sorted but when it has been cracked, it's like riding a bike, you never forget. They are now starting to ring with the band as a whole which is an important milestone.

We have been practising, and teaching, mostly at Padworth church since the bells are rung from the ground floor so there is a huge space for ventilation. This is in contrast with St Johns (opposite the common) where the ringing chamber is about 3-4 metres square. We still ring there for service on a Sunday morning but only for a short time and with a nominated six ringers. In fact the Padworth bells have been rung more this year than in a very long time which is good for them mechanically.

We hope you heard and enjoyed the ringing on the 6th February for the 70th anniversary of the Queen's accession to the throne in 1952.

We are now looking forward to the warmer weather since a church is quite chilly in the winter!



Burghfield and Mortimer Community First Responders

As you can imagine it has been a busy couple of years for the local CFR team responding to 999 calls. Not only have we been out to patients in the Burghfield and Mortimer but also to surrounding villages and Reading; it all depends on where the Control Room require our assistance. Covi has changed a few ways we carry out our calls with additional PPE and added challenges. Hopefully you have spotted the new Dacia Response Car out and about, sporting the green and orange livery.

The Burghfield and Mortimer First Responders currently have a team of 6 volunteers actively dispatched to emergency 999 calls on behalf of the South Central Ambulance Service; individually we give a minimum of 20 hours a month 'on duty' time which has increased more recently to support the elevated demand on Ambulance and NHS resources. The types of call we attend include cardiac arrests, heart attacks, strokes and diabetic emergencies, seizures, breathing difficulties and concerns for welfare, to name just a few. We also attend non-injury falls where we can use specialist lifting equipment to help patients up off the floor and often avoid the need for a full ambulance and crew.

During non Covi times we attend local fetes and shows offering CPR and AED (Defibrillator) usage demonstrations; it also gives us a chance to say hello. Fingers crossed, this is something we can return to soon, it would be great to have as many people aware of this life saving knowledge as possible. Do you know where the nearest AED is to you? Slowly the numbers in the villages are growing, next time you're out for a walk, see how many you can find. SCAS have a free Save a Life App you can download which gives locations of all AEDs in the area.





Even though we are part of the SCAS Team we are completely funded by the South Central Ambulance Charity. We have always had great support from local donations and for these we are truly grateful. The Charity is opening up some new roles for anyone who would like to volunteer to help but doesn't want to be involved with the clinical side of the CFR role.
