This perfect Halloween treat featured clowning, audience interactions and some excellent visual gags and made for a very special and very funny night. It was great to see some younger members of the village enjoying the show and we hope to be able to offer more theatre that appeals to the 14-25 year olds in the future.

Aladdin zipped into town on his magic carpet on December 10th. Gary Starr Pantos once again delivered two wonderful packed-out performances of the well-known classic. A feast of traditional fare, our family audiences shouted and booed, cheered and sang and we hope MVP helped bring a little more festive cheer to round up 2022.

Mortimer Surgery Patient Participation Group (PPG) met on the 19<sup>th</sup> January. As announced previously Dr Gill French will be retiring at the end of March after almost 29 years, and she will be missed, however there should be sufficient cover at present and efforts are being made to recruit. Nursing staff are up to strength





and a second paramedic will start in April. New clinical workstations are being set up in the upstairs room to allow good working conditions.

The PPG are planning an early evening 'Health in the Future' event with the surgery team on 7th June in St John's Village Hall at which we will present and showcase the range of services available now and developing into the future. The programme will include talks from different specialists, including the new Social Prescriber, who will discuss the range of helpful organisations and groups that can be accessed for anyone who is struggling with personal or social issues. Full details and timings will be available later.

The PPG expressed their thanks to Graham Robinson for his valuable contributions to the group, in recent years as Vice Chair, as he is stepping down. John Bagshaw will take on this role.

It was agreed to restore activities and levels of communication now we are post pandemic, and a noticeboard will be reinstated in the waiting room. The website will also be updated with recent minutes and event announcements.



Phase 1 of Greening Mortimer was successfully launched on  $14^{th}$  January. This was a lively, informative community event which promoted the 8 Challenges that had previously been chosen at a public meeting. Each Challenge comprises of making simple changes to our daily lives to both save money (a great benefit at this time of soaring energy prices) and importantly, decrease the amount of  $CO_2$  we release into the atmosphere. Acting as a community the  $CO_2$  saving is significant.



Each Challenge was represented at the event with fun facts and useful tips on how to achieve the changes needed. There was theatrical entertainment on stage with 1<sup>st</sup> Mortimer Scouts demonstrating the challenge to "Turn Your Thermostat Down by 1 degree C"– with a hilarious 'putting on jumpers to keep warm' race. The event was celebrated by a stunning performance of the Hurst Singers who had rewritten lyrics to include the Challenges.

The Experience Exchange was immensely popular. Mortimer residents and experts exchanged their experiences and knowledge of green technologies with fellow residents, who were keen to learn about these without feeling the pressure to buy. In addition, Dads Shop provided a useful display of energy-saving lighting. We will shortly be in touch with those who attended the Launch and requested thermal imaging.

At the time of writing, the card count was in progress. The estimated carbon saving by participants will be published as soon as it has been calculated by the Greening Campaign.

Following the completion of Phase 1, Phase 2 will focus on more advanced, joined-up ways our Community can improve Mortimer's carbon footprint and benefit us all. This will include:
