# **Mortimer Surgery Patient Participation Group**

The group met for the last time in 2023 on the 14<sup>th</sup> December and welcomed Maryam Rizwan from Willink School who joins Holly Raynor and Iona Cola as young members who can contribute ideas and energy and at the same time learn about Primary Care which may be useful in their future careers.

Shirley Cullup chaired the meeting and read a report from Dr Bradshaw (who unfortunately had been taken ill on the day). The Practice had been affected by illness among the doctors in the previous week but was working hard to maintain accessibility for patients. The two paramedics, Gemma and Abby, are doing a great job seeing most of the acute minor illness cases now, but covered by a doctor at

all times so patients can be seen by a GP if required. Another doctor is being sought to join the practice to further improve access, especially for female patients requesting to see a female GP.

The group discussed possible topics for the next public meeting and unanimously agreed to propose the topic of diabetes, together with lifestyle and diet management, to the doctors for approval. A date towards the end of June will be determined once holidays were taken into account.

# **Greening Mortimer**

**Thermal Imaging:** Greening Mortimer successfully acquired two thermal imaging cameras last year. A number of people have stepped forward to volunteer and have been practising with the cameras over the last few months in order that they can carry out visits on properties. In general terms a typical review takes one hour to complete which is then followed by a short report providing pictures of the property's hot spots and cold spots. This provides evidence of key areas to focus on to prevent heat loss and improve efficiency.

The process is not without its challenges and is reliant on there being sufficient temperature deviation between inside and outside and generally dry conditions.

Greening Mortimer are now ready to reach out to the community to push this work forward and an invitation email has been sent out to those who signed up at the launch meeting of January last year.

**Science 4 (S4) Nature Group:** The Group has been meeting regularly and the main progress has been made in the following areas:

- Follow up with TA Fisher on installation of swift boxes in new housing development
- Bio Diversity initiatives as follows:
  - assigning spaces to S4 members and liaising with landowners
  - highlighting various short term measures for immediate action
- Big Mortimer Nature Watch designed to log indicator species May 2024
- Spring/Summer presentation event designed to cover practical aspects for the community including; making changes to your back garden; recycling tips; how to get the younger community involved
- Other initiatives included barn owl boxes and water-quality monitoring.

On the 4th of January, Janet's funeral was held at St. Mary's church, Burghfield. It was no surprise that the church was filled with people of all ages, paying respects to a wonderful young lady who gave so much to the community.
