Mortimer & Burghfield Toy Library

2025 - How exciting, the Toy Library has moved into our very first session of the New Year by putting into place our digital service. We have finally moved from paper and pen records to using laptops, streamlining operations by facilitating secure management of items, members and loans. It has been a lengthy process as we are staffed by volunteers, who all have busy lives outside of Toy Library, but definitely very rewarding.



Toy Library still meet on the fourth Saturday of each month at Mortimer Methodist Church Hall 9:30am - 11am and we see new members join monthly.

Of course, when families move out of the area we are saddened to lose touch with children we have often watched develop from newborn and we have the neverending cycle of membership recruitment.

It is a real pleasure for the volunteers to watch children choose toys, very often large items that their parent/carer had not quite anticipated. Quoting a member from Saturday session "I might need to buy a larger car" as the little one excitedly gathered more toys. A member can borrow 15 toys per month which we consider good value for the £20 annual membership fee.

Our move to Lend Engine, an online platform, is still in its infancy but each session in 2025 will see us streamline our operation and members will eventually be able to browse and reserve toys online.

Mortimer Methodist Church

As part of its Eco Gold award, awarded in July 2023, the Church has a long/short grass policy and recognises the importance of grass seed research for the future of climate change.

Across the country, improved grasslands have delivered more grass for livestock but less for nature. Flower-rich hay meadows have been ploughed up and re-sown with fast growing ryegrasses. Barely 2% of traditional semi-natural hay meadows, whose wildflowers support a vast array of insect and bird life, survive. There has to be a more balanced strategy - nature needs diverse grasses that have deeper roots to draw down water into soil.

Scientists continue to seek smarter ways to use grass - high vigour seed means fast germination with growth in extreme cold conditions as well as 60% more

tolerance in high temperatures. Some grass species have capacity to store and sequester carbon within their leaves, roots and soil profile.

Grasslands that we use for leisure in towns and for food in the countryside will change in an era of rapid global heating. Farmers are investigating alternatives to rye grass monocultures as they recognise the need for the long-term sustainable production of grass.

Mortimer West End Village Hall

Just to let you know that our ever popular Family Treasure Trail and Woodland Walk is scheduled for Sunday 20th July. We are hoping that this year it won't clash with tennis and football finals!

As always, don't forget that the hall is available for hire at very reasonable rates. The large hall can be hired for £10 an hour on weekdays and £12 an hour on evenings and weekends. £6 per hour secures you the small hall. Our layout lends itself particularly well to children's parties, for which we have a special £55 rate for full use of the whole hall for four hours.

Burghfield & Mortimer Volunteer Bureau

- a service to the local community that works

This group of local residents have one aim – to transport other residents of these and



surrounding parishes, to and from their appointments at whichever hospital, doctors, surgery, dentist etc. when they are unable to do so themselves.

Becoming a well-known part of local community, the Bureau is now serving an increasing number of clients – up 4% in the last 3 months - to a total of 341. Each day the requests for transport have also increased to an average of 138 per month, the busiest day in the last 3 months having 12 drives. We also have half a dozen regular drives each week: two people to The Ambrose Allen Day Centre and four to the Headway Thames Valley Brain Injury Charity in Henley. Otherwise, in the last guarter clients have requested us to take them to local hospitals: Royal Berks and West Berks Community and other hospitals as far away as Basingstoke, Windsor, Frimley Park and Oxford.

Celebrating 50 years' service, this not-for-profit organisation relies on contributions from clients for each journey and grants from West Berkshire District, Mortimer and Burghfield Parish Councils and other groups like the Burghfield Residents Association.

It also relies on local volunteer drivers (who can claim 50p per mile) and other volunteers who take calls and perform admin work and bookkeeping.

Mortimer Local History Group

Our group goes from strength to strength, with very good attendance and interest at our monthly meetings (on the third Tuesday of the month at the Methodist Church Hall). Our September meeting was 'back to school' as we had a second hands-on meeting working through the archives, and there was an emotional moment where a member found a letter from decades ago relating directly to her family! October's meeting was called 'Village Entertainment', and after some information about events from 1750-1950, the floor was opened to members to recall their experiences of clubs and other activities in the village. November saw Dr Stephen Burt, Mortimer's very own expert meteorologist, talk about a hundred years of weather in Reading and Mortimer, amply illustrated with photos, historical documents and graphs, and there were many questions raised, and indeed answered, in an amusing and informative way. Our final meeting of the year invited members, many of whom have joined the group over the past year or so, to talk about their personal

histories...and what an interesting and varied bunch we are, all brought together by a common interest in local history! There is definitely scope for another similar meeting in the future, to find out about a few more of our members, and we are looking forward to another year of exploring and learning about the history of our wonderful village and other points of interest in the local area.



Mortimer Walking Group

We operate 'Wellbeing Walks' locally - a programme sponsored by West Berkshire Council, with all the walks led by trained volunteers. The routes are designed for people of all abilities (hence the differing lengths and start times), offering you an opportunity to meet new people and explore the beautiful countryside around the village. The walks are extremely popular and on top of locals we regularly attract people from as far afield as Basingstoke, Bramley, Thatcham, Baughurst and Tilehurst, as well as the closer villages.

Every Tuesday, rain or shine, we run three walks, all starting from the Community Centre car park opposite the Horse & Groom:

- 09:45 a longer walk of around five miles taking about 1³/₄ hours
- 10:00 the regular walk, around three and a half miles lasting about 1½ hours
- 10:30 a gentle walk lasting an hour or so

The aim is for all three walks to arrive back at about 11:30, and many of us then repair to the Horse & Groom, the Baobab or the Bistro for a coffee (or whatever suits!) At Christmas we organised two lunches in the H&G, plus mulled wine and mince pies in the Community Centre.



It's easy to start walking with us - just turn up 15 minutes before the start of the walk you want to join and speak to one of the walk leaders (the ones wearing high vis). We are all very friendly and newcomers are soon in conversation with other walkers.

Walking regularly is good for all sorts of reasons, not just trying to get a little fitter - it overcomes a recognised barrier to becoming more active by providing opportunities for social contact, has been shown to improve self-esteem, relieve symptoms of depression, anxiety, and improve mood. We often find that those on a walk have no idea where they've been as they've spent all the time chatting!

Mortimer Surgery Patient Participation Group

The PPG held its pre-Christmas meeting on 18th December during which presentations were made to Shirley Cullup who was standing down as Chair after many years of successfully leading the group's support of the Surgery and its patients. Apart from the Covid years this has included the holding of public meetings with speakers to present healthrelated topics which have been well attended.

Mortimer Community Centre

It may come as a surprise to many of you that the community centre on The Fairground is entirely run by a group of volunteers, and has been from the day that grants were first raised to build it almost 20 years ago. The management committee has just been infused with new blood and now consists of 6 enthusiastic locals, all working together to deliver a cost-efficient facility for the community.

Over the last few years there have been a number of bumps in the road, COVID and a serious leak within the heating system pipes in the ceiling of the building, to name just a couple. Throughout this the hall has continued to offer a space for local groups to meet and be active, even during COVID, when the ballet school used the hall to transmit video lessons to their pupils stuck at home!

The hall is now even busier than ever, with dance classes, Little Oaks, martial arts, Tai Chi, yoga, cricket, the Lunch Club and the WI, all meeting there. A recent audit of the hall and its activities by Connecting Communities in Berkshire (CCB) praised the facility for the wide range of ages and different activities that regularly used the hall. That said, there are a few slots remaining available, but most evenings will see something happening there. A lot of our users do take the school holidays off, so if you are looking for a venue to cater for any activity out of school term, we might just have the place for you.

The Hall has just been repainted throughout with other improvements underway, including new tables, to replace the old ones which have lasted more than 15 years. The hall will shortly have a website with an on-line booking system, so hopefully we can fill those few gaps that do exist and continue to support local groups and activities.

Mortimer & West End Cricket Club

We are delighted to announce the merger of Mortimer West End Cricket Club (MWECC) and Mortimer Cricket Club (MCC) to form Mortimer & West End Cricket Club (M&WECC).

We believe that this decision is in the best interest of a sustainable future for cricket in the villages and we hope we gain the support of the community to this end. The merger will see both heritage clubs' home grounds being used, and we will have the distinction of being one club with two home grounds in separate counties.

Andrew Williams, former Chairman of MWECC, described this decision as intended to create a strong, sustainable and competitive cricket club. He added "We will compete with three Saturday league teams, in the Thames Valley League (TVL), The 1st XI in Division 5, 2nd XI in Division 8 and 3rd XI, which will be a development team, in Division 9. Our Sunday friendly side will continue with a full fixture list.

We will provide members the opportunity to play cricket at a suitable level to match their needs and aim to provide a clear pathway for junior members to progress into adult cricket."

Tony Alder, former Chairman of MCC, noted that "it may have taken us 135 years to see the sense in joining together but I think now as a combined, united, club the coming years look more secure for the future of village cricket in Mortimer and West End."

A new Committee was elected on 19th January and has met to agree the next steps to ensure the club is ready for the 2025 season, when we will welcome both current and new members and hope to prosper in the TVL.

We will continue to provide coaching to children from the age of 5-15 and are engaging with local secondary schools to help provide indoor winter cricket opportunities.

We offered over 800 nights away camping to our young people, including a Group Camp near Oxford for 150 young people and various other camps and sleepovers for all sections.

The summer saw a joint camp between us and a visiting group from Denmark – 3rd Kolding Scouts. They had a busy week enjoying activities on site, coasteering, visiting Monkey World, and a day visiting the birthplace of Scouting - Brownsea Island. The older Explorers also completed an overnight hike, staying under a traditional Danish shelter at a scout hut in Bridport overnight before returning back to camp.

All sections had a varied programme with archery, shooting, climbing, and sailing being some of the most popular adventurous activities. Many of our groups visited either the Mortimer or Theale fire station or RAF Odiham this year and could often be seen out on hikes, litter picking, or exploring the woods in the local area. Scouting is about building skills for life, and we hope that those who join us will gain useful skills, build their confidence, and understand the importance of community.


