Conversions

Most of the old terms are explained as they occur in the text.


For the references to pre-decimal currency the following may be helpful:

$$20s \text{ (shillings)} = £1$$

 $12d \text{ (pence)} = 1s$

In older documents, numbers were frequently written in Roman numerals using lower case letters. Thus:

$$I = 1$$
, $ij = 2$, $iij = 3$, $iv = 4$, $v = 5$, $vj = 6$, $vij = 7$, $viij = 8$, $ix = 9$, $x = 10$ etc.
